"The Sun will be darkened and the moon will not give off its light." - Matthew 24:29

Since ancient times, people have closely watched the sky for direction. After all, the heavens were the realm of the Gods, and they moved with a consistency that was often absent in everyday society on earth. Every year, the seasons would pass and the stars would return to their places, with the noted exception of a few strange wanderers (*planets* in Greek) that moved about on their own course.

This consistent movement of the heavens established Holy celebrations that marked the presence and power of Israel's God as well. Festivals were set in season, taking us out of our own imminent present to honor the eternal realm. It was not uncommon for astrological events to mark the birth of the great leaders who would change the world, and our own scriptures are no different. Jesus' birth was heralded by the appearance of a new star, and even magi from distant lands recognized the importance of this because they were watching the sky.

As we discovered more about planetary motion and the movement of the skies, we also have become very good at keeping time with physical devices and gears on Earth. The more we watched our watches, our gaze has drifted to those things that are closer to our person, and we spend less time looking to the heavens to govern our lives. It has changed how we look at ourselves, and how we look at God. Yet every once in a while, an event occurs that takes our minds away from looking down at the next steps we take and brings our gaze back upward to the eternal realm - to the movement of the heavens and the incredible power and mystery they hold.

On April 8th, a lot of people are getting excited about witnessing the full solar eclipse that will direct our attention back to the skies in the middle of the day. Count me among them! I have been praying for miraculously clear early-April skies for some months now. An eclipse is unique in being both a very localized event and one of immense proportion. It is also a good reflection on our own relationship with God and God's Word. The convergence of the heavens to cast a shadow over our little patch of land is a good reminder of how the language of our scripture often casts the power of the almighty God of the universe into our own little lives in more ways than one, and this movement revealed in the highest heaven brings our vision back upward to the skies and reminds us of the message Jesus sent us promising to return.

In our own church calendar, we will be gathering soon to celebrate Easter and the resurrection of Jesus' body from the Earth to be revealed to us in *this* world. It was a sign of things to come, but Jesus himself knew that he would only be resurrected on Earth for a short period of time, ascending to be with God the father. Jesus taught his disciples that from there he would return. He also admitted that he had no knowledge of the time it would happen, saying that *only the Father knows the exact time*. This hasn't stopped us from predicting the second coming without success ever since, and this is exactly why Jesus warned his disciples not to be led astray by false teachers. Jesus teaches us that following his death and resurrection, there would be distress to come in the form of earthquakes, famines and wars that would be experienced throughout the world—and for thousands of years the world *has* been experiencing these calamities. Jesus reveals to his disciples that only *after* these disasters came to pass would he return, accompanied by signs in the heavens as foretold by the prophet Isaiah who revealed, "The Sun will be darkened and the moon will not give off its light ... and you will see the Son of Man coming with the clouds." It makes me think of an event like a solar eclipse, where the sun is darkened, and since the solar eclipse can only happen during a new moon phase, the moon will not give off its light. This year, the timing is even more of a powerful sign as the eclipse we will observe also falls on the very *last* day of the Hebrew calendar.

It's enough coincidence to get you excited - and humbled. We have to be careful not to predict with proud certainty, yet also must be careful not be so distracted by our own daily rhythm or unfulfilled expectations that we lose sight of seeking Christ and His return. All of these happenings are good reminders to keep looking to God and God alone in great hope and promise.

In coming to Holy Week, we remember Christ and the culmination of his ministry on Earth, and his resurrection a sign of the new life to come. It is fitting that on the *next* week, our gaze is shifted away from the tomb and up towards the sky, struck by the wonder of God's promises and how they come to pass in a movement so grand as to change our perspective on Earth. All of this to serve as signs that point to God's mercies which are new every morning, and a fresh beginning that lasts once and for all. Amen. - Alex



HOT CROSS BUNS

Make this traditional Easter recipe to remember how Christ gave his life for you.

What you need:

- 1 can (12 oz.) evaporated milk
- 1 stick (½ cup) butter, melted
- ½ cup sugar
- Pinch of salt
- 1½ Tablespoons yeast
- 1 egg, beaten
- ½ teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
- 5 cups flour
- Icing
- An adult to help

What you do:

- 1. In large bowl, combine the first eight ingredients.
- 2. Stir in flour, one cup at a time, to form soft dough. Knead on a floured surface until smooth and elastic (about five minutes).
- 3. Place in a greased bowl, turning once to grease top. Cover and let rise until doubled (about one hour).
- 4. Knead out air bubbles. Form six two-inch balls.
- 5. Place two inches apart on a greased cookie sheet. Cover and let rise until doubled (about 30 minutes).
- 6. Bake at 375 degrees until golden (13 to 15 minutes). Cool on wire racks.
- 7. Add icing in a cross shape. Enjoy!
