They said, "Is this not Jesus, the son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know? How can he now say, 'I came down from heaven'?" – John 6:42

On the first Sunday after Thanksgiving, we wrapped up our fall sermon series asking the question *Who Is Jesus*? While preparing the messages through the series, I really enjoyed reading the gospel accounts of people in *his* time asking this same question. As they did so, one thing that they were consistently confused by was the question of *where* he had come from. I enjoyed reading the accounts of the people asking themselves this same question because sometimes I have to ask the same thing. With the question being raised, *how* is it all supposed to fit together and work, exactly? I'm not always certain that our own carefully crafted theological answers to try to determine this have cleared a whole lot up for most people, but when the people of his time asked this question - especially those who were from Nazareth and the surrounding area in Galilee – they were even more confused because they actually *knew* Jesus' family. They knew Mary and Joseph, and knew that they had raised him. So how could he have come down from heaven?

As we get prepared for Christmas with the season of Advent, together we will engage this question of where Jesus came from with how it is answered from the stories we have in scripture – especially the ones that focus on family and his family roots. When we take this closer look at Jesus' family on heaven and Earth, we will also see how families are forged and formed. We will see how gathering the generations through love and instruction is a necessary ingredient for keeping a faithful perspective. We will see how Jesus' own family prepared the way for his ministry, and we will realize how our family in God strengthens the love we have for each other by carrying God's story forward from everlasting to everlasting.

To speak honestly, when we use the word family, it can be both one of the greatest blessings and challenges of life for everyone. For most of us, family is something that we cannot live without, and for some of us, family can also be something that we have a very hard time living with. Even still, when we lose a member of our close family, it can be something that changes our experience of the Hope of Christmas for us for a long time. When this happens, while others celebrate around us it can be especially hard for us to share in the joy and peace of the season. In making room for this loss, we are coming together for a Blue Christmas service on Sunday, December 17th at 4pm. It will provide an important balance for the joy we will have earlier in the morning as the newest generation of children comes together for the Christmas Play for the regular worship service.

Everyone's family is unique – and that is certainly no different when it comes to Christ. His Earthly lineage is full of heroes of the faith: both men and women who were main players in both Israel's history and our own story preserved in scripture. His ancestral line featured both insiders and outsiders. It included people instrumental in maintaining tradition, order and discipline. It also was balanced by outsiders who God used to soften the heart of His people and strengthen their faith, demonstrating what it really meant to welcome the foreigner into your land and to love your neighbor as yourself.

As the Earthly family expands, we are challenged to love more unconditionally and faithfully. At the same time, when we acknowledge God as the head of the family, we also recognize the unique character and person of God who brings a spiritual lineage that makes us holy in a way we could never do on our own. I know that in my own life, I am incredibly blessed to have both a Spiritual family in the Milton church and in the wider Church that transcends race and boundary. I also have an Earthly family that I am blessed to be very close with. A consistent prayer of mine is that the two would come together more closely, and I have seen God's action in answering this prayer. I also know that for those of us who have had a much harder upbringing, it can be hard to trust in God's promise of adoption and experience God's love when we have not seen it in a pure unconditional form in our own family. That is why God teaches us to have faith – faith that our story is only complete when God descends to Earth once again so our family truly can be together in person as one, both in Heaven and Earth.




"Peace on Earth" Ornament

Make this Earth ornament as a reminder to pray for the peace Jesus will bring when he returns.

What you will need:

- 1. Clear glass ornament
- 2. Blue and green acrylic craft paint
- 3. Sponge
- 4. Scissors
- Black permanent marker (Sharpie) or black puffy craft paint
- 6. Paper plate
- 7. Glitter (optional)





What you need to do:

- Cut the sponge into 2 rectangles, about the size of your tallest finger.
- 2. Pour a little paint onto a plate. (Add glitter if you want your ornament to sparkle.)
- 3. Use one sponge for blue and one for green.
- 4. Dab the paint onto your glass ornament one color at a time. Use green for land and blue for ocean to make the ornament look like our planet Earth.
- When the paint is dry, use the marker or puffy paint to write PEACE on the ornament.
- 6. Use your ornament as a Christmas decoration or give it as a present.
