

The tempest comes out from its chamber, the cold from the driving winds.

The breath of God produces ice, and the broad waters become frozen.

Job 37:9-10

"Last winter was so mild. I didn't even have to shovel the driveway!" These words would come out of my mouth with some degree of frequency over the last couple of years when the topic of weather came up in the conversation. Well, I won't be saying these words this year! This winter has been a real one indeed. Even as far south as Louisiana and the Florida panhandle they have gotten 8 inches of snow in some places. I hope you didn't plan your January trip to Destin this year! Which means that at home, the temperature is in the negatives ...

When I went to wake the kids up on our second straight 'cold' day of cancelled school, I saw snowy frost crusted on the inside seam of our new, barely 6 year-old windows. Every little pocket where the cold air could come through found its way into the home. So inviting!

Really, I was grateful behind the pane of the window. Just a couple generations ago, I would have felt this a lot different. In our everyday lives, God's power is often on greatest display through weather. When God chose to reveal his true power and scope to the mortal Job, it is written quite poetically how the tempest comes out from its chamber, and the breath of God produces ice. So described, I can see clearly in my minds eye an invisible hand behind the polar vortex reaching down to freeze the great lakes solid and cover the northern beaches on the gulf with snow.

Looking out of that window and seeing the cold only barely creeping in, I was reminded about how blessed many of us have been in this time and place to be shielded from this weather. It is not something I ever want to take for granted. It is also something that I am acutely aware of as I think about the suffering of others who do have to endure not just the cold weather, but a number of painful things. The cold creeping in the window reminds me of the calamities that Christ warns us of, creeping into the safety of our homes when we turn our trust away from God. God's creation, so untameable and powerful, still includes the most powerful creature of all - humankind - and that is why our rebellion has wrought such dire consequences.

That is why, when school was called off and the world stood still, I took God's cue to cherish the time that I have in the warmth, knowing that it was finite. I took time to think of my blessings as a glimpse of the relief to come, knowing that the greatest blessing lay beyond the chambers and storehouses of the tempests. The greatest blessing is a salvation that brings us comfort not simply here and now, but with the assurance of eternal life. This allows us to bear discomfort and pain and weakness most fully in this life, as Job had so experienced, and the frost on the window framed a small momentary picture of God's eternal glory and salvation through Christ Jesus. Amen.



### LOVE TREATS

Show others love by baking them a lovely treat!

### What you need:

- ♥ An adult to help
- ▼ Refrigerated cookie dough (sugar or chocolate chip)
- ✓ Jar of red jam (raspberry or strawberry)
- 1 or 2 heart-shaped cookie cutters. (If you use 2, make sure they are
- different sizes.)

  ▼ Powdered sugar
- ♥ Sifter
- Knife





#### What you do:

- Follow the cookie dough directions for rolling out the dough.
- If you are using one cookie cutter, cut out the heart-shaped cookies and transfer to a baking sheet. Try to have an even number of hearts when finished.
- 3. If you are using two cookie cutters, cut out the large hearts. Take half of the hearts, and cut out a small heart window in the center with the smaller cookie cutter. Now you have a heart inside another heart.
- Have an adult help you bake the cookies according to the dough directions.
- After baking, place the cookies on a cooling rack.
- When the cookies are cooled, make cookie sandwiches by spreading jam onto the flat side of half the cookies, and then placing another cookie on top of each one. (If you made cookie windows, use those for the tops.)
- 7. Sprinkle powdered sugar over your heart sandwiches with a sifter.
- 8. Share the cookies with the people you love.
