So from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view. Though we once regarded Christ in this way, we do so no longer. If anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come. the old has gone, the new is here!

- 2 Corinthians 5:16-17

I feel like I have written a version of this note before. In fact, I am certain of it. It is the all too familiar pastor's note for January—a timely note for the new year. It is the note to encourage us to turn the page on our calendar and move past the grief, anxiety, guilt, shame, and mess that came in the year before so we can 'get our lives together' with a fresh start in Christ.

When preparing this note, I was again drawn towards the 'new life' that Christ promises, but I wanted to write something *new* about this. Something easy to digest, personal, and bring us to practically 'turn the page' on sin and strive again for our new life in Christ. Something that lifts up the member of our church who pulled me aside not long ago to say, "I am just so looking forward to 2025." I am sure it was echoed in the minds of so many others who have had a tough 2024.

And this *is* the message, because this is a crucial element of the *good news*. God's mercies that are new every morning. *At the same time*, as we come into January again with a 'fresh start' in hand, I want to acknowledge the reality of our wise teacher from Ecclesiastes who wrote:

What has been will be again, what has been done will be done again; there is nothing new under the sun.

Is there anything of which one can say, "Look! This is something new"?

It was here already, long ago; it was here before our time.

The note about the fresh start - the new start - is anything but new. It has been done, and will be done again, and it is easy to read this pessimistically. Because that is what seems to come of those bad habits and worldly temptations that draw me back in every year I resolve to put them behind me. So it seems that it is the habits that plague our previous lives that are those things that 'have been done, and will be done again! Our 'fresh start' seems to spoil so quickly sometimes as outside forces quickly overwhelm and the movement of passing time provokes our anxieties. Then, the revolution of the Earth around the sun simply starts another cycle that we cannot be freed from.

That is why it is crucial for us to know that this 'fresh start' is not dependent on our own will or way. It all depends on Christ and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is not our behavior that we must change, but our perspective that changes when we are in Christ. We no longer see with our own eyes, but with His—and the eyes of Christ always viewed everything in light of faith. As the season of Advent draws to a close, we no longer simply await a future hope. We live out that hope as a perfect promise that has already been fulfilled beyond time. If we are in Christ, our view of people - including ourselves - changes. We no longer look upon each other from a worldly point of view, but instead look to each other with a present faith. With faithful eyes, we see that the new creation has already come. The new creation that was here already, long ago, before our time. The new creation that is growing like a mustard seed and leavening like a fresh loaf of bread beyond our perception. The new creation that separates good and evil, whose foundation is God's sovereign grace. This is what Jesus teaches in his sermon on the mount about the kingdom of heaven that is near. It is the kingdom of heaven that is around us already if only our hope turns into faith.

So it isn't our actions that are changed and transformed, but our whole person - because we are transformed with Jesus already. So if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come! Here already, long ago. Hallelujah. Amen.




