

VISIT FROM MUSKINGHAM VALLEY GENERAL PRESBYTER MATT SKOLNIK

On Tuesday evening, January 25th at 7pm, Executive Matt Skolnik will be speaking from the Presbytery about the reasoning behind a pastor's sabbatical leave. The meeting will be both in-person in the sanctuary and over zoom. Rev. Barnes' sabbatical proposal will be voted on during our congregational meeting after worship on January 30th.

The LORD said to Moses at Mount Sinai,

"Speak to the Israelites and say to them: 'When you enter the land I am going to give you, the land itself must observe a Sabbath to the LORD.

Leviticus 25:1-2

Every time the calendar turns, we are afforded an opportunity to view the new year as a fresh start. All over our society, our romanticized hope that we will establish new discipline and dedication to self-improvement finds renewed purpose. We can *turn the page* on the troubles and difficulties of the *last* year and make the most of the next. Often, we see opportunities to take on new things and commitments, but in order to do this and to see new life, we often need to either change or take a break from other things in our lives.

Pending the congregation's permission, this year I hope to take a 3-month sabbatical leave during July through September of 2022. This time apart is encouraged by the Presbyterian church and is available to take after six years of ministry at one church. The purpose of this time away is both for the minister's growth and the growth of the congregation in different ways. Ever since I started ministry at the church 9 years back, I have been growing closer to the congregation in my role as minister. I hope that this is the year to take a step away from tending this *field* for a few months both to rest and more importantly see how we fit into the bigger picture.

The Lord, when directing the ancient people of Israel, spoke of the importance of Sabbath both in their own lives and in the lives of the land. Every seventh day, the people were *commanded* to rest, and to prepare for that time of rest ahead of time. Every seventh year, the people were *commanded* to stop farming the land for a year and let it lay fallow to produce naturally. When we look at this practice of Sabbath, we can immediately see the Sabbath as a time of needed rest. If we take a longer look into the command and its origins, an important element of the Sabbath is to see the *rest* as a wider perspective is established. After all, God focused on creating different aspects of the world in each of the six days of creation, but on the seventh day, he rested from work so that they *all* could be enjoyed and appreciated in how everything came together. Often, only when we get a break from working in our field can we appreciate how many different fields make up the landscape. Only when we get a chance to do something else can we understand how everything fits together in a natural sort of way.

In a certain way, this is true with fields that are tilled as well. Crop rotation has been an important understanding of the agricultural world since the beginning of the practice, and this aspect is present in a Holy way as part of the Hebrew law referenced above. For seven years, most plots of land are owned by someone and produces crop that the people want ... but for one year, that owner is to let that land rest as it naturally produces – renewing the land as part of God's larger creation. If the Sabbath time is granted, I hope to use that time to explore how other branches of Christianity and other churches worship, while also developing writing and reflecting in a poetic way.

It is important for us that each new year, we have a sign of this new beginning, because sometimes it can be hard to start afresh when so many of our surrounding circumstances stay the same. We get into the same rhythms dictated by the seasons, and if nothing changes, we can quickly become tired without even knowing it. That is why I also encourage you to look at your lives and commit to taking a Sabbath from something in your life, for the purposes of intentionally living in a more holistic way. I know that this is easier said than done, and often needs great preparation and support to do so – even if it is planning for a getaway or vacation or enlightening trip for a small period of time. Take the time to communicate and prepare, returning to your commitments with renewed perspective, dedicating both the work and the rest to God. I hope and pray that everyone commits to being healthy in 2022, and that the next year is one filled with great purpose and love – and hopefully a bit of rest that widens our perspective of God's presence and deepens our trust in God's amazing grace.




Just for KIDS


