Every holiday season, I am reminded from almost every aspect of society that this is the season of giving - especially from the advertisers. Everywhere we look, we are encouraged to give to one another, and we are encouraged to obtain things to give them. Of course, the generosity of the 'season of giving' might not extend to the retailers that we purchase these gifts from, but that is another matter. Make no mistake, Santa's main role is to bring good gifts for the good children, and many of us are expected to give good gifts to our children, nieces, nephews and others. This is, in fact, not a bad thing. In scripture, Jesus himself points out how we, even though we are evil, know how to give good gifts to our children! I am not here to deliver a sermon on the greed and materialism that comes from the holiday season. There have been plenty of great messages that point out the problem with the gross consumerism that comes from our practice of Christmas celebrations and the poverty that is often exploited for gain during this time. I think about the rampant sin of greed behind the World's accepted ways plenty enough already!

In reality, what I have been thinking about is that very thing our world encourages us to think about this time of the year: What gift to get certain people for Christmas? I get envious sometimes, because it seems like Santa has it easy. The kids make a clear cut list, and (provided that the things on that list are not too abstract for Santa's workshop to create) the item is then miraculously delivered through a chimney or air duct or vent so it arrives at your house without any windows broken or locks picked along the way. I'm always impressed by how surprisingly nimble he is considering his well-rounded frame! Just one more aspect that shows the magic of Christmas. Unfortunately, the question becomes trickier when we need some ideas, because sometimes we don't always know what we ourselves might want, much less one who we love!

As we grow older, gift giving changes as we accumulate more things throughout the year, and we generally have more power to obtain many things whenever we want. As this happens, things often are no longer of much importance to us, and we are taken to a place where we desire gifts that seem more impossible for the world to fulfill. And this is, in fact, what God wants us to desire. For these are gifts that only God can give. These gifts include health, blessings, peace, and joy and the like. Every bit as much as Jesus teaches us to give ourselves to one another, Jesus teaches us to turn to God as we seek his blessing for our lives. He teaches us to unashamedly ask for these things in prayer, and as we do so, we go to God as God's children who are dependent on His provision and instruction. This is one area of Jesus' teaching where we can see the multi-dimensional truth that shines forth in having multiple witnesses from different gospels: In Matthew's gospel, it is written that 'Which of you, if his son asks for bread will give him a stone? Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a snake? If you then though you are evil know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask him?' (Mt. 7:11) Immediately, we are put into the role of God's children, asking God to give good gifts - and when we turn to Luke's gospel, another layer to this request is uncovered when Jesus teaches them 'how much more will your father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?' (Lk 11:13)

As the church began to grow in the power of Christ's victory over death itself, the Apostle Paul teaches the Church in Corinth about Spiritual gifts that are given to the believers through the power of the one Holy Spirit, empowering them in God's service. After instructing the believers on the diversity of unique gifts that are given to each believer, he then encourages them to yearn for even greater gifts. This is when he begins to describe the greatest gift: the gift of Love in its purest, most faithful and unadulterated form. As we think about both what we might want and how to bless others in the gifts that we give, think about the love that God desires and inspires. Think about our own witness and experience of God's grace. Where have we seen God? And how can we be an instrument to bring others to experience the greater gift of God's love even in little things? This doesn't always come in the form of a devotional or a book. In fact, for many who don't know God as well, it often doesn't. Pray that God will bring something for you to give. Then, as we look towards the coming year, do we ourselves ask God for the gift of His Holy Spirit? For this is the only gift where God's pure love can shine forth. May this season of giving demonstrate the incredible power and generosity of God as he instructs us what love really and truly is.

FOOD PANTRY UPDATE





Creation KALEIDOSCOPE

Make this fun craft to remember what our heavenly Creator made. $\Lambda \circ \Lambda$

What you need:

- Adult help
- Tall chip can with lid
- Hammer and nail
- Acrylic paint; paintbrush
- Water, glitter, white glue o
- Colored tissue paper
- Stronger craft glue (not hot glue)
- Star stickers or sequins
- Two 4" x 5" pieces of clear Con-Tact paper •
- Scissors; pencil; permanent marker

What you do:

- In bottom center of can, hammer a hole with a nail. Paint outside of can. Let dry.
- 2. Add glitter and a little water to white glue. With a clean paintbrush, glue tissue paper to bottom outside of lid.
- 3. Add stars to sticky side of Con-Tact paper. Place a matching piece on top, sticky sides together.
- 4. Put craft glue along edge of can opening. Glue Con-Tact paper square over opening. Let dry.
- 5. Place lid on can, over Con-Tact paper. Turn lid to get kaleidoscope effect.
- 6. With marker, write "In the beginning ..." on can.
