#### Pastor's Note for July 2025

So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ. - Ephesians 4:11-13

Last year's first Lions club community parade was certainly a memorable one. While the Milton Presbyterian Church did not have its own float in the parade, there was a lot of behind the scenes involvement from a number of our church members. I still hope that we can have a small float this year, but last year we couldn't do it because many of us were involved in the whole thing—and my own role in the parade was to hold the honor of being called to judge the people. While I was flattered to be seen as someone with good judgment, I also know that Jesus taught the people "Do not judge, or you too will be judged. So I decided to get ahead of the matter and welcome such judgment from others by dressing up in my preacher's robe and donning the only wig I could find in my house - an American flag bandana with long dark flowing locks cascading down the back. If you only looked above the shoulders, I looked a bit like Nicholas Cage from the classic action film Con-Air. No, it was not a movie about hairdryers, but as I alluded to, it does feature some great hair ...

As I watched a wonderful parade, my disguise must not have been good enough. As he was walking by, Wayne County Commissioner Ron Amstutz recognized me as the organizer of our Rittman Ministerial Association and approached. He wanted me to know about something that he was excited about—and it wasn't my new look. He had been working with a group called ReviveOHIO in setting up a county-wide revival among the churches in our area that make up the Church in Wayne County. Not long after, some of the organizers behind ReviveOHIO came to share their mission and vision with us at our Rittman Ministerial Association meeting in January.

Much to my surprise things started coming together quickly and, before I knew it, the revival was already planned and happening! Literally before I knew it. After our local meeting in January concluded, it sounded as if we were looking towards getting something together in the coming years. By April, I had heard that the revival was happening this July! Once again I could witness how swiftly God acts when it has been blessed by His grace. I also saw it as another answer to a long time prayer of mine for God's Church to come together in this place and work together for God's mission in the gospel—and the timing of it all was part of this witness too ReviveOHIO in Wayne County will begin the day after the Rittman Community parade this year, just as the Sleepwalker festival commences. Almost exactly a year's time from when it was brought to my attention!

For a week, starting on Friday, July 25th, a group of local missionaries will equip people in local churches for the work of ministry - to share the good news of Jesus Christ and make disciples of Him. Over those seven days, a lunch will be hosted by a church in different areas of the county where members and leaders of local churches will be equipped for ministry during that time. One of the lunches to equip and teach will take place here at Milton on Thursday, July 31st! We will be joined by other local churches and missionaries coming in from different parts of the state who will be sharing their excitement for sharing the good news, and how we too can share that good news as our lives are continuously transformed and molded into Christ. In this, just as God reveals in our scriptures from Ephesians chapter 4, we may be unified as one church under Christ, who gave himself to the apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors and teachers the gifts to equip the people for ministry.

You too can be a part of how God works in this! If you haven't given your life over to Christ, make that commitment first. If you have, pray that God gives you the courage to use your gifts through the power and guidance of the Holy Spirit. Ask others if you can pray for them. Pray over how you can help either serve lunch or participate in this effort. Pray that the Milton Church grows with those who desperately need God's hope now more than ever, and pray that this is not a momentary event but one where new seeds can be planted, ready to grow deep roots reaching into the rich soil of our beloved community ripe for renewal through the power of Jesus Christ our Lord and the power of the Holy Spirit. Amen.







# FROSTY FRESH

# GRAPE POPS

Jesus is our vine, and we are to be his fruitful branches. Have "bunches" of fun making this refreshing grape snack.

#### What you need:

- An adult to help
- 4½ cups seedless grapes (red, green or black)
- Food processor
- Plastic spatula
- Strainer
- Mixing bowl
- Whisk
- 2 teaspoons sugar
- Food coloring (red, green or blue; optional)
- 5 oz. paper cups
- Aluminum foil
- Popsicle or craft sticks
- Another 2 cups grapes, halved (optional)

#### What you do:

- 1. Blend grapes in a food processor until smooth.
- 2. With a plastic spatula, press mixture through a strainer into a mixing bowl. Discard skins and skim foam off the top.
- 3. Whisk sugar into juice until dissolved. Add a few drops of food coloring, if desired.
- 4. Fill cups with juice, spooning most of the foam off the top. (If using additional grapes, put <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-cup halved grapes into each cup.)
- 5. Cover each cup with foil and insert a wooden stick into the center of the foil.
- 6. Place cups in freezer.
- 7. To remove pops, take off foil and tear away cup. Enjoy!

**Variation:** To make layered juice pops, make two batches of mix from different-colored grapes. Fill cups half full with one color, cover and then insert the stick and freeze. Then fill with the remaining color and freeze again.


