Rejoice in the LORD Always. I will say it again - rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident towards all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. - Philippians 4:4-6

I had already listened to the bad news in real time, and it hit me hard. It shouldn't have, really. After all, it was all meant to be entertaining - and it was, but it was still hard to take. It just so happened that the good guys were on the wrong side of it now, and our once invincible pitcher gave up another home run to Aaron Judge of the New York Yankees. Then, on the next pitch it seemed, Giancarlo Stanton homered again, bringing the Yankees ahead in game 3 of the American League Championship Series. My spirits were low, but there was life to take care of in the house, and I didn't want to be tempted to listen to Tom Hamilton's voice while ignoring the voices of real people next to me.

So I turned off the game and helped the kids upstairs. Andrea got them ready for bed, and remembering that I hadn't yet written in my prayer Journal, I went down to my home office to pray. As always when writing in the prayer journal, I began recording what I was grateful for. There is a reason why the apostle Paul writes that in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. Giving thanks is crucially important to recognizing how many blessings we do have in life which we may take for granted: health, wealth, food, people, purpose, or the multitude of small prayers that God answers every day. It is easy to accept them as life, but we must remember that our sustenance and blessings all come from God.

So I wrote what I was thankful for, but even as I did this, it was hard not to check the score of the game, hopeful for a late inning rally. I looked at my phone and saw that it was still 5-3 Yankees, and there were two outs in the bottom of the ninth. As far as the ballgame went, I was resigned to defeat. My heart was irrationally heavy, and when I got to my petitions - those prayers that I lift up for my own soul and character to be shaped by God, I prayed for God to lift my heart and spirit. Honestly I was also guilty about feeling so down about a baseball game - something that doesn't matter a lick in the long run - but the fun of sports is that there is a chance to it, so the disappointment is real. As I finished te prayer, I checked the score again, and it was tied. While I was away, Jhonkensey Noel, AKA 'Big Christmas', hit a massive 2-run homer to tie the game. So I turned the radio back on to listen to the rest of the game.

Only one inning later, with all the momentum on our side, David Fry hit a home run to win the game. It was exhilarating - and a fascinating answer to prayer. Make no mistake, I do not believe the almighty cares about who wins a baseball game. I do believe that God cares deeply about how we witness to God's power and glory over our own - and that is what I saw in this moment of overtly answered prayer. So I finished writing my prayers requesting things that have more eternal consequence mattering far more than a feeling that lasts hours to days, and then continued to listen to the postgame show. As David Fry was interviewed, he said that at the moment he hit the home run, 'I was just like, I just told God, like hey, man, take this. It's a tough matchup, just try to have fun.' If I thought that my prayer habits may trend towards the informal, even I don't go as far as to call upon God by saying 'hey, man' - but somehow for Mr. Fry it worked, and I can understand how when staring down a 98mph fastball there isn't time for any formal address. God, take this ... and just try to have fun. Wise words, in fact - and a very sincere take on the Apostle's petition from behind prison bars to 'rejoice in the Lord always', knowing that there will be highs and lows to life. That is probably why the command was repeated!

There was some strange peace after that game. It was *fun* to watch the rest of the series, and while the next two games were close, and good, there was also a sort of fatalistic sense that there was no way this fortune could last. It didn't - and it didn't really matter anymore. I was not despondent or downtrodden like I was that night with my prayer journal. My heart was at peace, because I saw God's glory above everything else, and I remembered once again the Apostle's words that mattered far more when we are faced with losses that aren't experienced in a game. Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again, Rejoice! Do not be anxious about anything. With prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. So during this season, as the weight of responsibilities and hosting and the anxieties that can come from family and relationships and loved ones who have been lost, let God take this - and try to have fun. Rejoice in the Lord! And soon enough, we will find that this rejoicing doesn't just mean celebration - although it can. It encompasses far more than mere jubilation. It is a resounding peace that puts the good things that are right in front of us into full perspective, which is but a dim projection of the great and glorious, victorious reunion that God has planned from the start.



Holiday (andle

On Thanksgiving, we share a special meal with family and friends. Make this holiday candle as a festive centerpiece for your table.

What you need:

- Paper towel
- One 8-oz. clear plastic cup
- Petroleum jelly (Vaseline)
- Paper or plastic disposable bowl
- About 8 oz. of a variety of dried beans, peas, corn, etc.
- Bottle of white glue
- Plastic spoon
- An 8- to 10-inch taper or dinner candle
- Adult to help

What you do:

- Using the paper towel, rub a generous amount of petroleum jelly on the inside of the cup (bottom and sides).
- 2. In a bowl, pour the dried-bean mixture.
- Squeeze enough glue into the bean mixture to generously coat it. Stir the mixture with the spoon.
- 4. Spoon about half of the bean mixture into the greased cup. Then place the candle, with any plastic wrapping removed, into the center of the mixture. Next, fill the cup with the rest of the mixture. Smooth the top to make it flat, making sure the candle stays straight.
- Squeeze extra glue around the hole made by the candle. Let the bean mixture dry completely, which could take a day or longer.
- When the bean mixture is dry, gently pull the candle. Both the candle and beans should come out as one. (If they don't, pour more glue and wait another day.)
- 7. Place your candle on a small plate for a festive Thanksgiving centerpiece.
