13th. Last sale day is October 6th.


Tickets are \$12 and will include lasagna, bread

So with you: Now is your time of grief, but I will see you again and you will rejoice, and no one will take away your joy. In that day you will no longer ask me anything. Very truly I tell you, my Father will give you whatever you ask in my name. - John 16:22-23

It is always good to see the church from a different perspective every once in a while. I was afforded that privilege early in September when I took a Sunday away from the pulpit, worshiping from the pews. As I settled in, I saw people arrive through the doors and my heart warmed with joy to see many familiar faces come into the sanctuary. I was also very aware that a number of people gathering for worship were grieving the loss of a loved one - some quite recent. Some had been in worship only a few weeks before. Others, some months.

And my heart was heavy and filled with deep gladness at the same time. It is only with faith and courage that we can face our creator at the most difficult moments. It is not always easy trust in the one who is the source of every joy and sorrow on Earth knowing that our pain could have been avoided with a different reality. That is why it is all the more important to gather together as one people to bear pain and also heal with joy as one people - to Rejoice with those who rejoice; and mourn with those who mourn. (Romans 12:15). When we gather for worship, we not only find comfort in sympathy, but also the assurance of ultimate power revealed with this word of truth: that the love of God is from everlasting to everlasting.

Still, accompanied by this promise of hope and love is often a painful trial: that things will not be the same absent the familiar voice singing or whispering or chuckling at some point in the service - all fueled by the breath of God, the Spirit of all the living. This is what makes returning to worship as one so difficult at times. This is also why it is important to trust in God's story as revealed in our scripture, because there are plenty of times when the gathering of believers in worship feels akin to waiting. On the one hand, it can feel like we are waiting in grief and confusion for something, like the moment when the disciples were gathered in a room just before the risen Jesus came through the walls into their midst. Or it can seem like we are waiting in excited anticipation and deep prayer, like the disciples who just witnessed the risen Christ ascend to heaven to be with his Father, instructed to go to the upper room and prepare to receive the promise of the Holy Spirit.


I have lived long enough to know that the trials that we go through better prepare us for the next step that God wishes us to take in our lives. This is true individually, and is true even more powerfully together. When Jesus tells his disciples that they too will experience deep grief, it is because he is very honest with them about the trials to come. It also doesn't take long for Jesus to reveal that following their time of grief, they will be empowered with a deeper spirit of prayer that will reveal the power of petitioning God within themselves. Prayer would be answered in a new, more powerful and direct way - and this is the excitement that we should share with the disciples today as we weather our own trials and grief. Something great awaits, and I have seen the stirrings of this as well as we come together more fully as the Body of Christ. I am excited to grow and celebrate the coming season as the weather turns, bringing more people into the hope that Jesus gives us in His return, revealing a joy that can never be taken away from us: the pure and perfect love of God, from everlasting to everlasting. Amen.

<u>ITEMS are always needed for the pantry.</u> Staples are needed. Usage has been very high! Currently personal items are needed as are pasta or noodles, instant potatoes, cereal, pasta sauce, canned fruit, peanut butter, canned meat, quick foods like canned stew, and personal hygiene items (especially shampoo and bar soap, and feminine hygiene products.)





As Jesus tells us in the Parable of the Good Samaritan, all people are our neighbors. You can make a difference for others, beginning in your own neighborhood. Make and share this craft so people know you care and are thankful for your community.

#### What you need:

- Clear, disposable, nonpowdered, non-latex gloves
- Craft paint
- Paintbrush
- Popped popcorn (about 3 cups per glove)
- Rubber bands
- Ribbon or raffia
- Construction
  paper or
  cardstock
- Markers or crayons
- Hole punch

#### What you do:

- 1. Paint one side of the glove's fingertips to look like fingernails.
- 2. Fill the fingertips, then the rest of the glove, with cooled popcorn.
- 3. Wrap a rubber band around the wrist of the glove.
- 4. Tie ribbon or raffia around the rubber band.
- 5. Make a card. Ideas include "Welcome to the neighborhood," "Thanks for being such nice neighbors," "Here's how we'd like to serve you," etc.
- 6. Punch a hole in the corner of your card and tie it to the glove.
- 7. With an adult, pass out your "neighborly" gifts.
