Thank you Pastor Alex and Bill Crawford for preparing our June 24th community meal. Our guest speaker was Elfie Salisbury who spoke about the process of writing a book.

The community dinner for August is Monday, August 26th, where there will be ham sandwiches, macaroni and cheese, and salad. Our guest speaker is Bella

Nardecchia who will speak about her recent mission trip to Honduras.

September's community dinner will be held on Monday, September 30th. The speaker will be from the Wayne County Childrens' Services.

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. All the believers were together and had everything in common. - Acts 2:42-44

So our witness from Acts recalls the newborn church being blessed with life, and life together. At this moment, the Holy Spirit had just come upon the Apostles on the Day of Pentecost, only 10 days removed from Jesus' ascension to Heaven and 50 days following the resurrection of His Body. We see the Spirit's presence in the gathering of believers, who spent their time together as one people who had everything in common after just having heard the gospel for the first time - the good news that they have been given new life and life eternal in the power of the Holy Spirit after repenting and turning to Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.

And here we are today, roughly two millennia later - and the message remains the same. The ideal remains the same. The gospel remains the same, and so does this example of what the Body of Christ looks like. The witness we have boils it all down to 4 simple things that constitute our entire lives as believers - simple things that anyone is able to do, no matter what our physical or mental God-given ability may be. Studying the apostle's teaching, fellowship, breaking bread and prayer. Yet far from being idle, there was plenty of active work to be done in study, in preparation of the bread, in preparation for fellowship, and time devoted to being with God. Even as distractions have pulled us apart in many different directions and the signs performed by the believers begin to dim in the power of our own ability to harness the riches of God's provision in our physical realm, the simple life together enriched by the immensity of God's revealed truth remains the same.

On September 21st, we will be hosting a meeting of the Muskingum Valley Presbytery, a group of Presbyterian churches in our region of southeastern Ohio. Volunteers from Milton and Seville are preparing breakfasts and lunch to host, and we will set aside time for fellowship and study of the Apostles' teaching and for prayer as a reminder of who we are - one people in the power of God's Holy Spirit. We will gather in prayer so we might remember and recover this beautiful reality of God's people.

Yet still it all seems to pale in comparison to what life looked like when the first believers were gathered together in the power of the Holy Spirit. The beauty of our denominational connection is that we have an opportunity for fellowship with other churches who gather in towns hours away under the Gospel that we have in common. At the same time, the denominational nature of the gathering betrays how we have become divided and broken as a people. As believers, we have been distracted by teaching that diminishes the person of Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior. We replace Jesus with more specific principles and values that are in fact a reflection of our own, shaped in our own time. As individuals, we have become divided by our inclination to control our surroundings, and we have been pulled from our life together by our own desire to be elsewhere.

As a result, we give up gathering together, and we give up the desire to invite other people into our life together. Our Hope in the Gospel of Jesus Christ diminishes, because it is no longer the most powerful force in our lives - so we do not talk about it much. Yet *still* we are in a more blessed position than any other time in history, because every single day is a chance for renewal and repentance and new life in Christ. You are invited to be a part of our gathering on September 21st. You are invited to our gathering every Sunday at church. But you are invited to much more than that! An invitation to share in the body of Christ extends to all parts of our lives, so throughout the week, let's make it our very first priority to be devoted to these things in our life together: reading scripture as we study the teaching of the apostles. Getting together for times of fellowship. Getting together for meals where Christ Jesus is present, and turning to God in prayer. Everything else - from working our jobs to maintaining our health to learning at school and getting the kids ready for school to reading a good book to having a good time - all are parts of life that simply support our life together in Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.



Smart cookies

September is an exciting time, as you begin growing in wisdom with a new year of school and Sunday school. Be a "smart cookie" by making this special container for your kitchen. Change the pictures as your year goes by. Or fill the container with cookies to give as a gift.

What you need:

- 2 identical disposable plastic containers (rectangular and clear)
- 1 lid
- 4 photos or drawings
- Scissors
- Sticky bow or ribbon (optional)
- Cookies

What you do:

- 1. Cut four different pictures or drawings to fit the sides of your container. Allow the edges to slightly overlap around the four sides of one container.
- 2. Gently set one container inside the other. Then slide the pictures or drawings down between the two containers to cover the four sides. Press the inner container down to secure the pictures in place between the sides.
- 3. Fill the container with cookies, and put the lid on top of the inner container.
- 4. You can put a sticky bow or ribbon on the lid to make the container look like a present.
