## SUPPER'S READY!



Every year around September, two aspects of church life are re-established so people can grow closer to Christ. One is the beginning of Sunday School. The other is when members of the Nominating committee begin asking church members if they feel ready to undertake ordained ministry in the church – in other words, whether they sense that God is calling them to be an Elder or a Deacon.

Some of you who are reading this might know *all too well* the tasks of being an Elder or Deacon. Some of you have been an Elder or a Deacon for years ever since someone asked you to do so, probably only a year or two into being a member of the church! Some of you attend church faithfully and might not be full members or ordained as Elder or Deacon, but help out in so many other ways. Others have served as Elders or Deacons but may not have attended church in a while, and still others might just be reading this to keep up with news from the church.

Regardless of what your knowledge of these positions might be as you read this, there is one phrase I hear consistently whenever anyone first takes on a position of official leadership when it comes to church: 'I didn't know that there was so much to do to help lead the church ...'

If you've had the pleasure of attending a meeting in the life of the church, you know that there always seem to be a lot of things that need to get done, from cleaning the church to coordinating Junior Church and family events to getting the Audio/Visuals set up to making sure that someone is there to unlock and open the church for events to the budget to look after. If you didn't think of all of these things, that is OK – because Cindy Mann ends up taking care of most of it. Then there are also programs to run, people to visit, meals to host – and this isn't even to mention everything that the Milton Presbyterian Women do for missions.

When it all adds up, it can be very tiring, and also very time consuming. Yet people found the time because it was a priority. People also have become burnt out when everything becomes too overwhelming.

There are always things to be done – and this extends far beyond the life of the church. In fact, the office of Deacon is specifically geared towards actively helping society's most vulnerable and for helping church members. Ruling Elders have also often found a large number of tasks sitting on their plate ... but as we think about everything that needs done and how much it can seem at times, we have to remember what forms the backbone of our *church*. Not just the church's leadership, but the Church as a whole.

The Greek Word for Elder is *Presbuteros*. This might sound familiar, because it is where we get the title of our denomination from – *Presbyterian*. No, it's *not* because we are an *elderly* congregation ... it's because we are wise and authoritative like our elders!

It is actually because the decision makers of the church are a group of Elders that are elected by the congregation. It goes deeper than this, though. There is a commitment the entire congregation has to fulfill in the two basic tasks of an Elder: to seek understanding in God's word and apply it to your life through the power of prayer. These are things that must be practiced by *everyone*.

This coming month, there are more organized opportunities to pursue each of these things. I have asked each Ruling Elder to stay committed to praying daily and recording their prayers by journaling. I heard from Northside Christian Church in Wadsworth about a joint church prayer/renewal practice called Awaken *Ohio* that starts September 12 that you can find more details about in this newsletter. When it comes to studying God's story, we are starting 30 Days to Understanding the Bible for our Sunday School classes.

Still, the fact remains that for many of these things, it is just one *more* thing to put on your plate. I understand that organized commitments such as these are difficult for some of you, and that is why, if it all seems overwhelming, start with the basics. Set a time aside to simply *pray* and *read scripture*. Pray for family, friends, and through the church list. Make it a practice to read scripture, and if you don't know where to start, try Mark's gospel – the shortest record of Jesus' life.

There will be plenty of opportunity to participate in programs at church that help direct these activities – and it would be *excellent* for you to take these up. The most *important* thing that you can do, however, is to simply start – and if you have questions along the way, ask a trusted person who goes to church.

I hope that when you *read* this, you too become curious and committed to learning more about *yourself* and God's design for you life as a part of His story.






