The proverbs of Solomon son of David, king of Israel: for gaining wisdom and discipline; for understanding words of insight; for receiving instruction in prudent behavior, doing what is right and just and fair; for giving prudence to those who are simple, knowledge and discretion to the young-let the wise listen and add to their learning, and let the discerning get guidance-for understanding proverbs and parables, the sayings and riddles of the wise. The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and discipline. – Proverbs 1:1-7

It was a great privilege to walk with the family as we took my son Gus to school for the first time. He was just starting pre-school at Rittman, and I finally felt like a real community parent. I am so grateful that we live in a place that values learning, education, and discipline. Wisdom, education and discipline embody this book of Proverbs in the middle of our scriptures.



Some are straightforward maxims that espouse righteousness, morality, discipline, hard work and productivity. Others are more mysterious – possibly a wordplay that glistened with luster when heard in their rightful time and place, or imbued with greater meaning sometime in the future. That is part of the beauty of God's Word in our scriptures – sometimes meaning is opened up in times to come, rather than simply lost to the past. As this collection of wisdom has been passed down through the ages, the wise King Solomon invites us to learn and listen.

Let the wise listen and add to their learning, and let the discerning get guidance ...

When we come together to learn more about Jesus and who he was, it is important to note that while he was not recognized by all as the Messiah, he was recognized as a great teacher. Even atheists and agnostics come away with this impression, because he taught many important truths that stand out through the ages. Just as the proverbs teach with images and parables, so did Jesus. Some of these stories and sayings are simple and understood by all. Others are more mysterious to those who may not yet have an understanding of God's great and awesome love. All are meant to be heard, and the most important thing that we can do as disciples – those who would be disciplined and instructed by this teaching – is to listen.


Jesus often would begin teaching his parables with the phrase, those who have ears to hear, let them hear. As the fall brings forth the harvest, and the fields spring forth with their own fruitful ears, the school year begins and the seeds of knowledge and wisdom are sown. As the kids begin school, don't forget that we too are always learning. Reconnect with God's word in scripture and the natural world. Find renewed discipline in this learning. Listen with fresh ears to the teaching of the master who gave his life for ours. He is the same one who gave his life for every child in the generation who is walking to school today.



GROWING UP FAST!

In September, Monarch butterflies migrate to warmer climates. In God's wonderful design, these butterflies have gone through an amazing transformation. This craft will remind you of the ongoing transformation that God has planned for you, too.

What you need:

- Clear, one-gallon zipper baggie (with no writing)
- Colored tissue paper
- Scissors
- Wooden, one-piece clothespin
- Pipe cleaner
- Black permanent marker
- Glue and wiggly eyes (optional)
- Magnet tape

What you do:

- 1. Turn the baggie inside out and rub it on your head to create static cling. Then turn the baggie right-side-out again.
- 2. Cut tissue paper into 2° x 2° squares.
- 3. Fill the baggie with tissue squares.
- 4. Press excess air out of the bag and zip it. Lay the baggie on its side (this will form the butterfly's wings) so the zipper is at the top.
- 5. Pinch the baggie with the clothespin so it divides the baggie into two equal parts to create the butterfly's head and body.
- 6. Thread the pipe cleaner through the hole atop the clothespin to form the antennae.
- 7. With a permanent marker, write "Romans 12:2" on the bottom half of the clothespin.
- 8. Draw on eyes (or glue on wiggly eyes).
- 9. Attach a strip of magnet tape to the back of the clothespin. Then display the butterfly on your refrigerator.
